FORT MCKAY

Telephone call received at 2:40 p.m. from Mrs. Helen Roy of Fort McMurray who had received prior instructions from the Metis Association to investigate certain complaints received from Fort McKay, regarding the bussing of employees to the G.C.O.S. plant. M4755

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<u>REPORT</u>: (conversation taped) The following is the transcription of the information taken from the taped telephone conversation with Mrs. Helen Roy of Fort McMurray, who at the time of phoneing, had just arrived from Fort McKay.

- -Both Treaty men and Metis men are being charged \$10.00 per week for using the bus as a means of transportation to G.C.O.S. plant.
- -There are Five Treaty men and Two Metis men who take the bus from fort McKay.
- -The bus belongs to Indian Affiars, however G.C.O.S. supplies all the gas.
- -The employees who take a bus from Fort McMurray which is a distance of twenty miles pay only \$3.50 per week. The distance from Fort McKay to the plant is not any greater than that from Fort McMurray.
- -In the event that the bus from Fort McKay breaks down, the Treaty men take a taxi, and Indian Affiars pays the cost of this taxi. The Metis men are not allowed to ride on the same taxi as the Treaty men. Mrs. Roy in conversation with the treaty member of the five that take the taxi, Mr. Wilfred Grantkam, stated that Mr. Grantkam was not certain who gave the instructions for the Metis men not to take the same taxi as the treaty men, only the the Taxi driver would not take them. These instructions could have perhaps come from Indian Affairs, who pay the Taxi fare for the Treaties.
- -The taxi used for these trips is Slim's Taxi of Fort McMurray. The payment of the taxi when the bus breaks down appears to be the only agreement that Indian Affairs have with G.C .0.S.
- In regards to the \$10.00 per week deducted from the men's paycheques for the transporation to the plant by bus, it is not certain where this money goes, however, Mr. Grantkan, felt it must be going to Indian Affairs, as the band fund has plenty of money to cover expenses.
