



In 2015, the New Democratic Party won an unprecedented political and ideological victory in Alberta. Unseating the Progressive Conservatives—who had won every provincial election since 1971—they formed an NDP government for the first time in the history of the province.

Orange Chinook is the first scholarly analysis of this election.
